

## ICOM CC Working Group Graphic Documents Newsletter 6, March 2025

The ICOM-CC Working Group Graphic Documents is in its term 2023-2026.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> of September 2024, 5-7 pm CEST we conducted a virtual presentation and invited three speakers. The Working Group Graphic Documents organised a virtual event with three speakers. There were 94 participants in the Zoom session. 25 % were ICOM members, 65 % were interested colleagues and 10 % were students.

Georgios Boudalis, Thessaloniki, Greece, began by presenting his book "On the edge: endbands in the bookbinding traditions of the Eastern Mediterranean". Perfectly drawn illustrations visualised the many variations and forms of endbands. It was a great pleasure to learn from his research and passion. Georgios is the head of the book and paper conservation laboratory at the Museum of Byzantine Culture in Thessaloniki/Greece. He has worked as a conservator and researcher in various manuscript collections, mainly in monasteries such as those of Mount Athos/Greece and Sinai/Egypt. The second speaker, Herre de Vries, Amsterdam, Netherlands, talked about his daily practice as a book conservator and highlighting ways to achieve minimal intervention solutions. It was fascinating to see how much in-depth knowledge is necessary to perform high-end conservation treatments. Herre is coowner of the Amsterdam-based conservation studio Restauratie Nijhoff Asser- RNA - restauratie nijhoff asser. He holds a higher professional degree and an MA in book and paper conservation and started his career in 1999 working as a bookbinder at Atelier Kloosterman Boekbinders in Amsterdam. The third speaker was Abigail Bainbridge, London, United Kingdom, who presented the book "Conservation of Books" as editor in chief. Bringing together over 30 authors in one volume with all sorts of specialties showed the deep interest in the field of book conservation, but also the patience required to complete such a great project. She is a book

conservator and Director of Bainbridge Conservation. She has taught extensively on the degree programs at West Dean College, Camberwell College of Art, and City & Guilds of London Art School, as well as on bookbinding and conservation courses at Richmond Art School, Morley College, City Lit, Women's Studio Workshop, and London Centre for Book Arts.




Figure 1: screenshot, 23 September 2024, presentation from Georgios Boudalis (© A Pataki-Hundt)




Figure 2: screenshot, 23 September 2024, presentation from Herre de Vries (© A Pataki-Hundt)
