Drawing together approximately 1000 professionals from diverse corners of the world, encompassing both ICOM & non-ICOM members, these conferences serve as a dynamic platform for the exchange of experiences, ideas, & insights. Attendees forge valuable connections with colleagues & representatives from heritage institutions, ensuring they remain abreast of the latest developments & trends in cultural heritage conservation. Following the success of Copenhagen 2017 & the virtual event in Beijing 2020, the conference in Valencia 2023 offered an exceptional opportunity for networking including presentations, a vibrant trade fair, engaging social events, & enlightening technical visits in addition to the latest research presented by our 21 Working Groups. The overarching theme of this Triennial Conference, *Towards a Sustainable Past*, placed sustainability at the forefront of numerous presentations. While sustainability has become a ubiquitous catchphrase, this conference aimed to elevate it beyond mere rhetoric. Valencia 2023, invited participants to engage with & draw inspiration from the concept of sustainability, offering a broader vantage point that transcends conventional perspectives.

### Grants

The event prioritised diversity & access through support grants for attendees from Cat. 3&4 countries. Funds provided by ICOM Young Member Grant were awarded to 1 individual from India to attend. Thanks to our valued partner, the Getty Foundation, 20

individuals participated in programmed sessions. The Stichting ICOM-CC FUND aided 5 Working Group Coordinators in mitigating attendance costs. The Indian Institute of Heritage covered expenses for 7 contributors & the Chinese Museum Association/ICOM-China facilitated the attendance of 5 individuals. Trade fair sponsors TruVue & Deffner&Johann covered registration fees for 10 Spanish students & 5 emerging professionals respectively. APOYOnline's support allowed 5 individuals from LAC regions to attend. Our hosts, Universitat Politècnica de València, covered registration for 25 young professionals who served as stewards. ### 3. ICOM-CC & ICOM-France. Special Project

24 May - 22 Nov 2023. ICOM-CC session 22 Nov 2023

Museums & their social & environmental responsibilities: towards an ethical & sustainable model; ICOM-CC session: Emergency plans & reconstruction

Partners: ICOM NC: France (lead), Canada, Spain, Lebanon; ICOM IC: ICTOP, NATHIST; ICOM RA: Arab, LAC, & Université du Québec Trois Rivières.

Aligned with the sustainable development objectives of the UN Agenda 2030 & congruent with ICOM's strategic plan for 2022-2028, this project sought to establish an international dialogue forum. The primary objective was to showcase the innovative experiences of museum professionals worldwide, emphasising their practical commitment to fostering a more sustainable future (SDG4) in their day-to-day operations. The thematic cycle, centred around six topics, aimed to stimulate fresh & inventive perspectives on museums & sustainable development, encompassing both environmental & societal aspects (SDG13). The diverse range of topics was strategically chosen to empower participants with insights for enhancing the social & societal role of museums. The discussions were geared towards illuminating how museums, as dedicated institutions, could contribute to constructing a more equitable world (SDG16). The ICOM-CC session was moderated by Chair Kate Seymour.

In 2023, ICOM-CC reaffirmed its commitment to cultural heritage conservation practitioners' professional development through mentorship-based training. The Getty Foundation's Connecting Professionals grant supported 20 recipients from 14 countries attending the 20th Triennial Conference in Valencia, covering registration, travel, accommodation, & on-site expenses. A rigorous selection process, led by a panel of five Directory Board members, vetted over 60 applicants from Eastern Europe, the Middle East, Latin America, Africa, and Asia/Pacific regions.

For the first time, the grant assisted 4 mentors with prior program experience. These mentors, well-versed in ICOM-CC triennial conferences, played a pivotal role in connecting the other 16 recipients & paved the way for connections with other delegates throughout the week. They offered guidance on navigating the event, highlighted opportunities, & facilitated networking.

A social event brought together recipients, Coordinators, and Assistant Coordinators from 21 Working Groups, fostering connections among individuals with similar backgrounds & research projects. These connections, nurtured throughout the event, are transforming into enduring relationships, strengthening the collaborative fabric of the ICOM-CC network.

Since its 1993 inception, the Getty programme has benefitted over 300 individuals, exemplifying ICOM-CC's enduring commitment to global cultural heritage conservation. [1451]

### 5) Other activities

Any other project or activity which has not been mentioned in the above outlined activities could be shortly described here. Those projects could for instance be a Special Project or Solidarity Project partly funded by SAREC (if not already included in the other types of activities), a working group dedicated to a specific topic, the development of a database, or any other examples useful to the members of the Committees, to ICOM or to the museum community. [3000]

- 1. ICOM-CC's leadership changed in 2023. The shift marks a moment for the Committee to revitalise & adjust its Strategic Plan, updating the latter & aligning it with ICOM's.
- 2. ICOM-CC consists of 21 Working Groups led by elected Coordinators, whose terms last a maximum of 2 trienniums. The recent Triennial Conference in Valencia marked the transition from the 2020-2023 cohort to the 2023-2026 cohort. Recognition for the outgoing leaders' dedication & the introduction of the new leadership occurred at the ICOM-CC General Assembly during the conference's final day. While 3 Working Group Coordinator positions were closely contested, unfortunately, there were no candidates for 5 positions. 10 candidates vied for the 9 spots on the Directory Board. Elections were conducted via a Google form, with results overseen by adjudicators and posted mid-week during the conference. 4 members from the 2023-2026 Directory Board returned, and 5 Coordinators began their 2nd term. Following the September conference, the Directory Board recruited volunteers to fill Coordinator positions for the 5 Working Groups without candidates. Since September, up to 6 Assistant Coordinators were nominated & approved for each Working Group, providing support for the Committee's leadership. Incoming Coordinators proposed a Triennial Programme for 2023-2026, aligning with ICOM-CC's and ICOM's Strategic Plans.
- 3. Participation in ICOM Statutory meetings & forums afforded the ICOM-CC representative valuable opportunities to engage with Chairs of other ICOM bodies, fostering the exchange of ideas & collaborative working practices. Particularly noteworthy are the quarterly meetings of the WGIC forum. The sessions held at the end of 2023 facilitated meaningful connections & played a pivotal role in planning for the 2024 call for projects issued by SAREC. During these meetings, a call for collaboration in the chat brought together Committees with shared interests. The application deadline of January 15 for this grant, 2024 prompted the Committees to convene & brainstorm in the final month of the year. This swiftly led to the formation of a consortium comprising multiple ICOM Committees, united in their goal to provide training in Conservation, Documentation, & Conservation Risk Assessment. This collaborative effort aims to support & enhance the capabilities of African museums & institutions dedicated to preserving cultural heritage, with ICOM-CC taking the lead in the project grant application. To enhance such collaborative opportunities, it is recommended that an annual Meet&Greet be organised after the summer period by the ICOM Secretariat. This event would serve to connect Committees, fostering the formation of consortia for joint grant applications & furthering the spirit of collaboration within the ICOM community.

### 6) Partnership & network

How did your IC/RA co-operate with other ICOM National Committees, International Committees, Regional Alliances, &/or other (museum) organisations? Please, describe the key collaborations & their results in the course of the year: [3000]

In 2023, ICOM-CC partnered with ICOM Canada, ICOM Spain, ICOM Lebanon, ICOM ARAB, ICOM LAC, ICTOP, & NATHIST forming a consortium under the leadership of ICOM France to address sustainability issues within cultural heritage. ICOM-France was granted funds by SAREC to organise 6 sessions, broadcast in French, Spanish & English, The project titled Museums & Their Social & Environmental Responsibilities: Towards an Ethical & Sustainable Model is reported above (Section Workshops). This collaboration sought to leverage the collective expertise of professionals from various ICOM committees & geographic regions. The programming for each session was coordinated by ICOM France in conjunction with individual committees of the consortium. Events were scheduled throughout the year & concluded in November 2023. Adverts for each event were distributed to ICOM-CC members & were well attended by those active within the Committee. The collaborative effort fostered a truly global perspective on the ethical implications of sustainable museum practices. Recognising the importance of cultural context, these initiatives aimed to strengthen the bonds between museums & their communities while promoting a shared understanding of the significance of cultural heritage. Addressing the environmental impact of museum operations became a collective endeavour, with ICOM-CC & its partners providing practical solutions to minimise ecological footprints & promote sustainable practices within museum spaces. The sessions facilitated the integration of educational initiatives, empowering museum professionals to communicate the importance of ethical conservation & sustainable practices to diverse audiences. The result of this multifaceted collaboration can be used as a blueprint for museums worldwide could adopt to embrace a more ethical & sustainable model. The recorded sessions reflected a harmonious blend of global perspectives & local expertise, setting a new standard for museums seeking to integrate social responsibility & environmental sustainability into their core values. This alliance demonstrated the transformative power of global partnerships in advancing ethical & sustainable practices, providing a template for museums worldwide to navigate their social & environmental responsibilities with unity & purpose. The growth in membership & the number of committee members who actively participate in the work of the committee illustrate a committee's dynamism. SAREC will look at the increase or decrease in membership, the geographical scope, the diversity of the members & the performance of a committee in relation to how many members it has. Especially the strategies & actions taken to respond to the expectations & needs of the

members as well as the development of memberships in terms of numbers & diversity will he welcome.

Have you implemented (new) institutional strategies to better attract individual members? [1000]

In 2023, ICOM-CC gained around 244 new members, showcasing the success of our initiatives to attract new members. Key methods include outreach & discounted conference rates. Engaging actively, we utilise 21 Working Groups, employing distribution lists, newsletters, & social media. Members access the portal via our website, joining multiple Working Groups without restrictions. Coordinators utilise dedicated Gmail groups for efficient communication, sharing updates on activities, initiatives, & relevant events. Our strategic communication emphasises ICOM-CC's dynamic activities, connecting with our diverse membership of around 5000. This strategy not only promotes our organisation but also attracts new members, particularly during the year of the triennial conference. Adjusted registration rates during the conference offer incentives for ICOM members to join their National Committee, a successful strategy evidenced by sustained individual subscriptions beyond the first year.

The contributions of emerging professionals are key to ICOM-CC's growth & vitality. Our tiered management structure affirms our dedication to nurturing the next generation of conservation leaders. This framework seamlessly integrates younger members & actively fosters their engagement in the early stages of their careers. More senior members mentor those entering the field. This reciprocal relationship cultivates a collaborative environment, where seasoned experience converges with fresh perspectives, providing continuity & transfer of institutional wisdom. As of the end of 2023, we welcomed 102 Assistant Coordinators, of which about one third are young professionals under 40, highlighting our commitment to diversity & inclusivity. Our unwavering belief in the potential of emerging professionals reaffirms our collective commitment to shaping a vibrant & sustainable future for both ICOM-CC & the broader community it serves.

The ICOM Young Member grant was awarded to Dr. Md. Ali Nasir, ICOM Member (71824), affiliated with the Indian Institute of Heritage in New Delhi, India. Dr. Nasir was granted the full amount of €1200 through the grant, which proved instrumental in offsetting expenses

associated with his participation in the 20th ICOM-CC Triennial Conference. Dr. Nasir's selection for the grant was based on both his age & his notable engagement in ICOM-CC activities & organisational structures up to the present. Having served two consecutive terms (2017-2020 & 2020-2023) as the Assistant Coordinator for the Textile Working Group of ICOM-CC, he demonstrated a dedicated commitment to the organisation. Additionally, Dr. Nasir had previously received grants enabling his attendance at the ICOM General Conferences in 2016 (Milan) & 2019 (Kyoto), as well as participation in the online 19th Triennial Conference (Beijing) held in 2020.

The selection process for the Young Member Grant involved considering all ICOM-CC young members under the age of 40 from Categories 3 & 4 countries who had served as Assistant Coordinators. Out of a pool of four Assistant Coordinators serving in the 2020-2023 term who fulfilled these criteria, each was invited to submit a letter of motivation. Following a thorough review of all submissions, the Directory Board ultimately chose Dr. Nasir as the recipient of the Young Member Grant for 2023. [1425]
